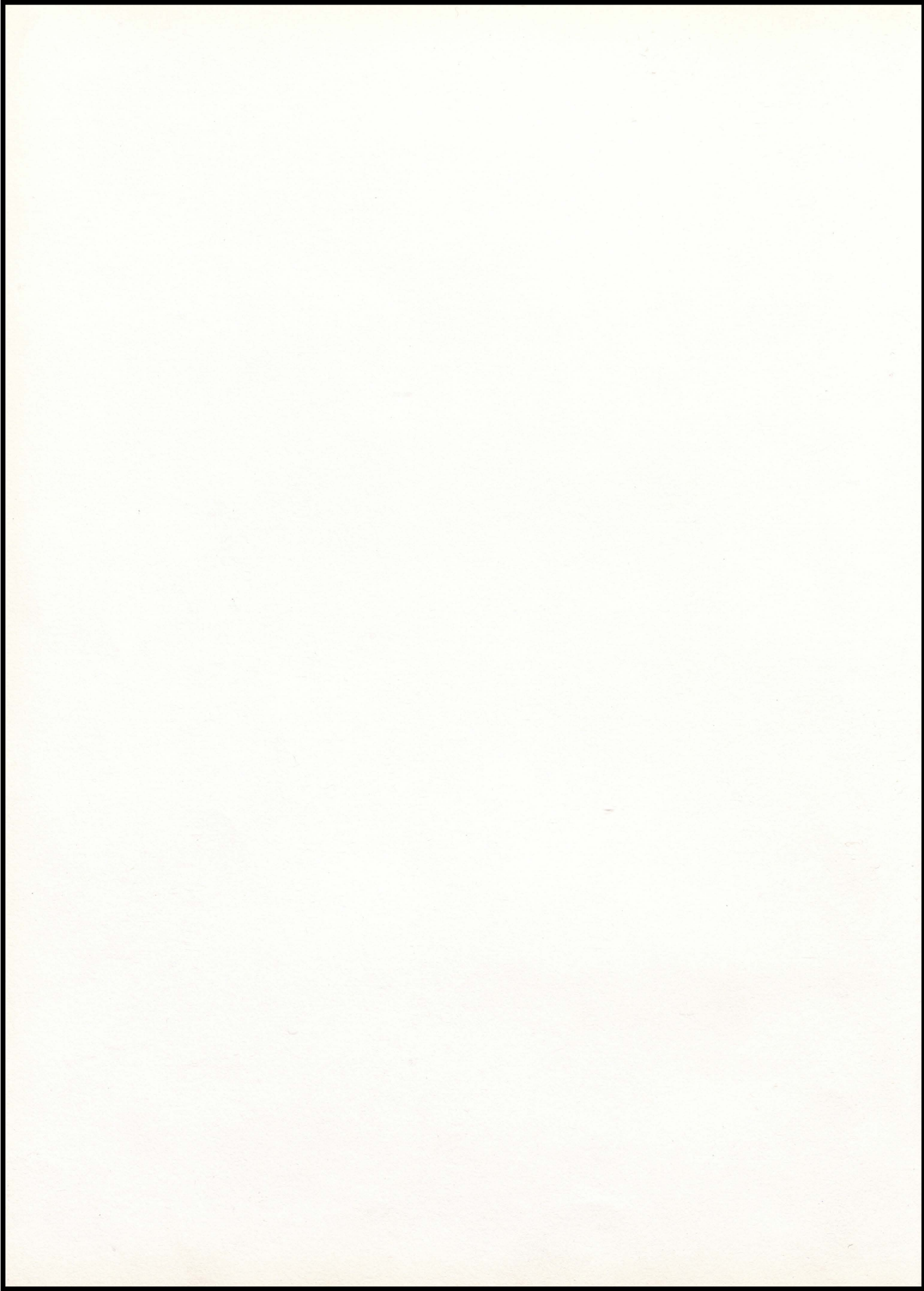

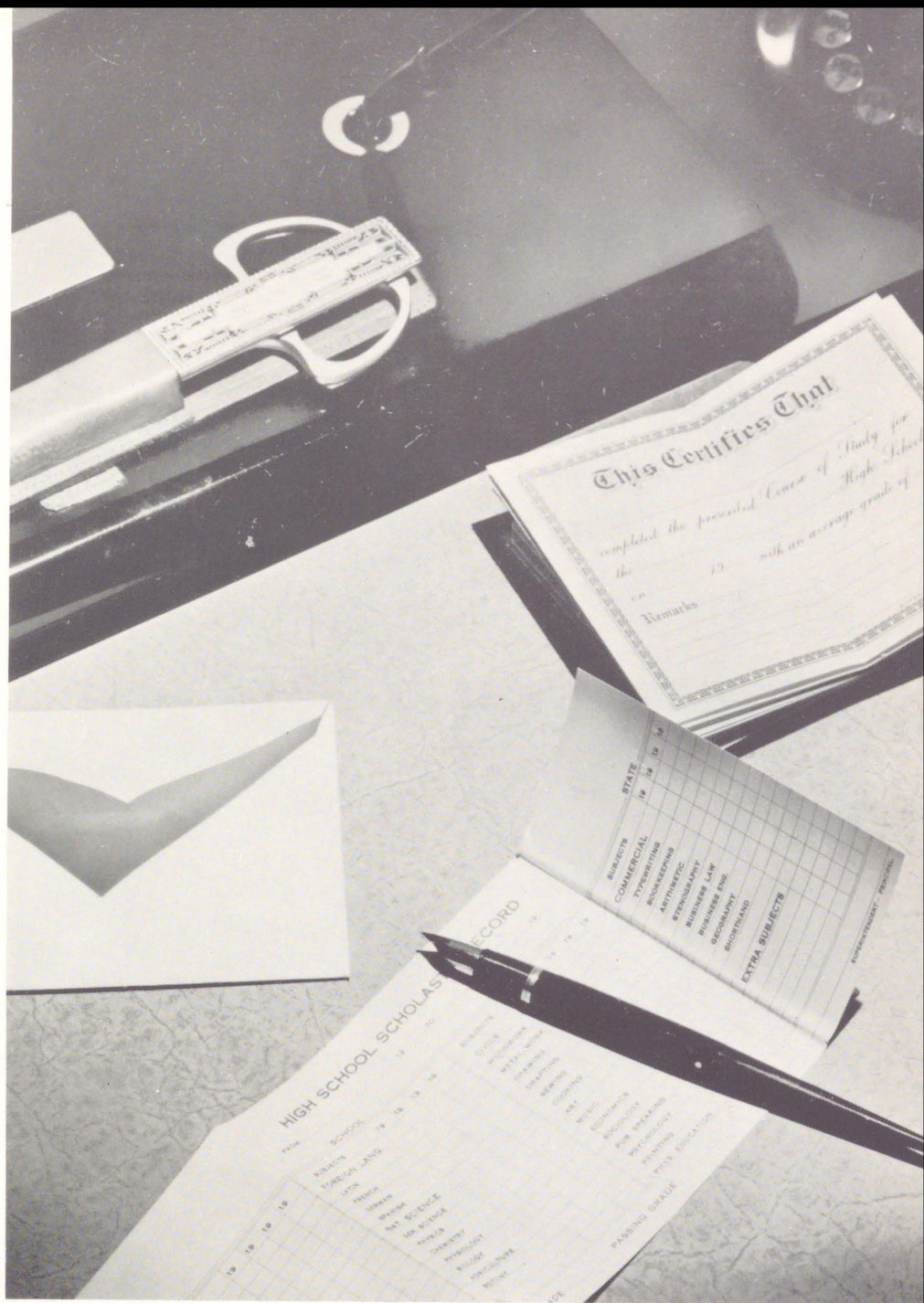


Dedication

Finally we come to our senior year and many of us thought we would never make it

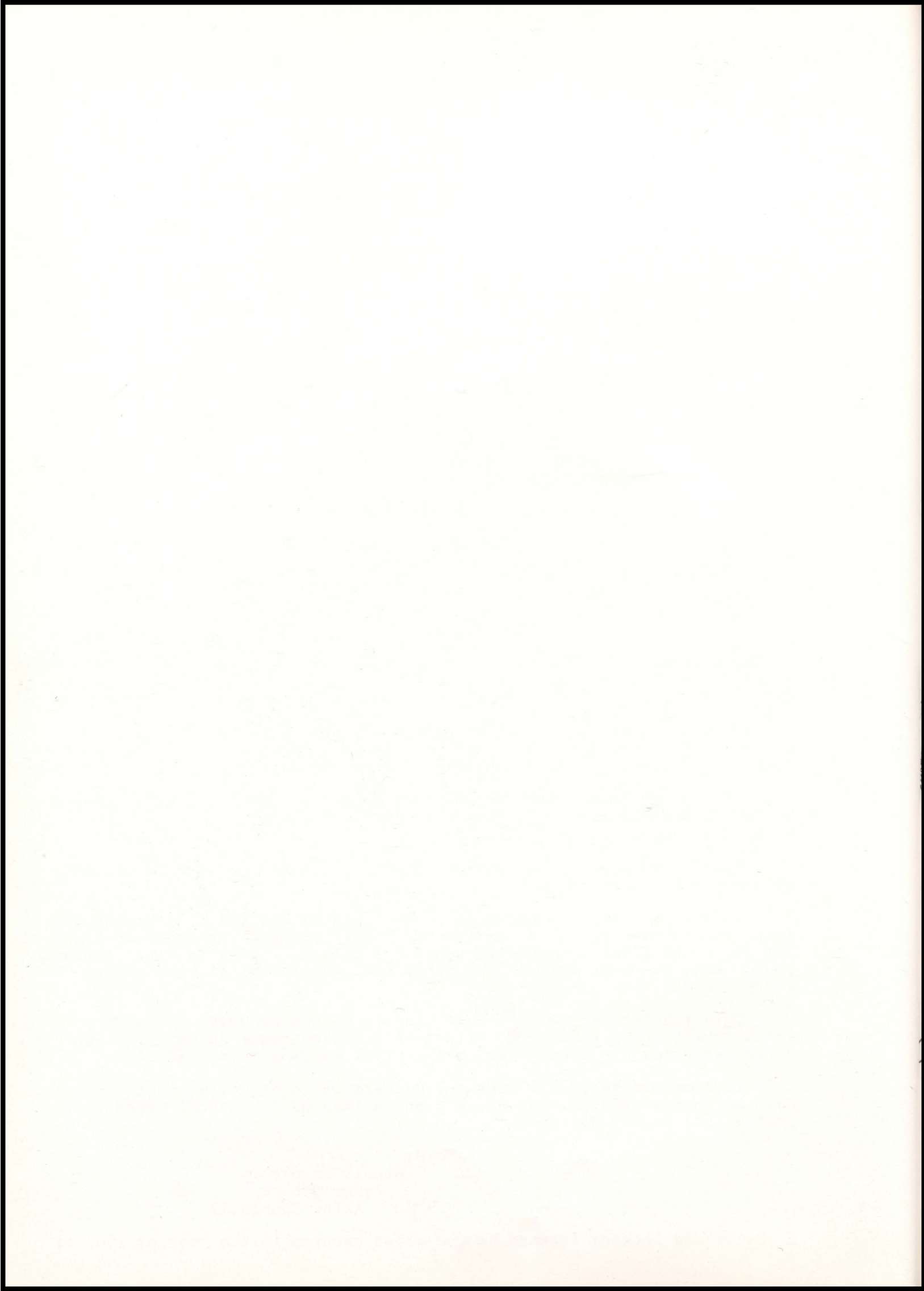
