Earl wills his comb to Shirley, Hoping that her hair will really get curly.



During our junior year two members of our class were sent to Badger Girls State and Badger Boys State by the American Legion. They were Betty O'Brien and Allen Churchill.


Finally we come to our senior year and many of us thought we would never make it


